Since 2006 The Wrens Nest has been working in conjunction with several local youth to feature a student written, student edited, and student published literary journal. The Scribes program provides students in the Atlanta area with the experience of becoming writers and editors to learn about the art of publishing first hand from Atlanta area professionals. The program features students from the KIPP Strive Academy and Brown Middle School. In fact the student's anthology Read After Burning premiered at the Decatur Book Festival. In 2013 the journal into Bright Tomorrow, featured 28 young writers, our largest project to date. With the generosity and support of our donors, none of that would have been possible.

The Wrens nest is excited to tell you that the program has the opportunity to expand into two new schools. The Wrens nest would love to provide this educational and creative project to more young people however in order to do this; the program must raise \$8,000 dollars by March 31, 2015 so that this program can be introduced in the Spring semester. The funds raised will be used to purchase program supplies, transportation, and educational field trips.
